From the City Manager

I'd like to thank the community for the warm welcome to Sherrill. Over the last several weeks I've had the pleasure of getting to know the City staff and some of the volunteers on the various advisory boards. All have shown a deep commitment to

serving the public, and their work ethic is admirable. I am extremely fortunate to have the support of former City Manager Bob Comis, and City Comptroller Mike Holmes. Their knowledge and advice has made the transition smooth. The Mayor and Commissioners have also been extremely helpful in providing guidance and structure to move the City forward.

Though our Spring has been wet, we are excited for the drier days ahead as we move into summer. We've been readying our parks and play fields and continuing work on the Betsinger sidewalk project, beautification efforts such as flowers and mulch, as well as several other projects. In the weeks to come work will begin on the renovation of the DPW Garage and on our 2017 road construction and paving program, parks and pools will be buzzing with activity, and the farmers market and concert series will be in full swing.

The recent announcements of two significant economic developments are welcome opportunities for the City. The construction of the new Maple Leaf Market on the corner of Sherrill Road and Route 5 is underway. And the repurposing of the former Oneida Limited buildings as part of the ONX3, LLC project is exciting for the Silver City. The City has applied for grant funding with the Community Foundation to help bolster our cultural and recreational programs and we are hopeful as we anticipate a decision. We are also exploring the NYS Consolidated Funding application process as part of Governor Cuomo's transformative plan to improve the state's economic development model.

There is a lot going on over the next few months, and I am excited to be part of the team and community. Hope to see you around.

Sherrill Fire Department News

Membership- The department is always looking for new members. If you've ever wondered how you could help your community, consider joining. If you're 18 years of age or older (male or female) visit the fire station during our Wednesday Night Drill that starts at 6:50pm each week for more information. We also have a junior firefighter program for young men and women who are 16 years or older.

Terms to Know- A *Severe Thunderstorm Watch* is issued to alert you to the possibility that thunderstorms with damaging winds and large hail may develop. A *Severe Thunderstorm Warning* is issued when a severe thunderstorm has been spotted and is going to move through your county soon. Remain calm and take precautionary action to protect your life and property. Listen to NOAA Weather Radio and local media for weather updates and stay informed.

Grilling- Three out of five households own a gas grill. Each year an average of 8,800 home fires are caused by grilling, and close to half of all injuries involving grills are due to thermal burns. While nearly half of people who grill do it year-round, July is the peak month for grill fires followed by May, June and August. Grilling statistics:

- In 2012, 16,900 patients went to ERs due to injuries involving grills.
 - 1 of every 6 home structure fires in which grills were involved were caused by something that could catch fire being too close to the grill.
 - Leaks or breaks were factors in 1 of every 5 reported grill fires.
 - Gas grills contribute to a higher number of home fires than charcoal.
- Please use caution when using outdoor cookers. Locate them a safe distance from all structures when in use. Backyard grilling can be an enjoyable aspect of the summer season but can turn tragic quickly if left unattended. Please do not use gas grills, turkey fryers and smokers on porches or decks that are attached to the house. Check all hoses to make sure they are in proper working condition and not cracked with dry rot.

Chimineas and Fireplaces- Fire code requires recreational fires not be within 25 feet of any structure or combustible material (including fences, hedges, etc). All fires must be constantly attended until extinguished.

Upcoming Garbage Pick-Up Date Changes

Garbage or Treasure Stat: The City of Sherrill generates an average of 6 tons of garbage every pick-up day.

Common Garbage & Recycling Mistakes

Overweight- Garbage may not weigh over 40lbs, recyclables 20lbs. Tip: place used cat litter in separate bag outside of container to keep containers under limit.

Wrong Size Containers- Containers shall have a capacity of no less than 10 gallons & no more than 32 gallons.

Damaging Materials to Garbage Truck- Construction debris & oversized/awkward materials are unacceptable.

Plastic Bags Placed in Recycling Bin- Although some grocery bags have a recycling triangle, they **cannot** be recycled thru the local recycling program. Bags can be brought to most local grocery stores for recycling/reuse.

Food Contents Still in Recyclable Containers- remove leftover pizza from box; rinse out food containers
Look up what's recyclable at www.AMIRecyclable.com.

Transfer Station Spring Schedule- Saturdays 8am-1pm & Wednesdays 4-7pm. The recent paper shredding event in April was a huge success! The next shredding event will take place in September. More details to follow.

Compost- is available for residents to take at the end of Fairway Lane, next to the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

Brush & Green Waste Pick-Up- Every other Monday through October 23 (June 19, July 5, 17 & 31, August 14 & 28, September 11 & 25, October 9 & 23) *Please do not place waste at curb prior to the weekend before the scheduled Monday pick-up. Also, please do not place green waste in roadway due to vehicle safety concerns and potential city storm water complications.

Brush & Green Waste Reminders- Brush & green waste piles shall: be free of any garbage, soil, rocks, animal waste, lumber, debris or inorganic matter, **not** be placed in any type of bag, twine, container, wire, barrel, etc. Brush must be less than 6' long and 4" wide.

Lawn Care Tips: Lawn clippings should always be left on the lawn so that the soil receives all the necessary nutrients it requires. Use of fertilizer can be eliminated by benefiting from the natural nitrogen produced from recycling grass clippings back into the lawn.

Getting to know your local ordinances

City of Sherrill's Ordinance No. 23 *Weeds and Other Vegetation*. This ordinance requires that the height of vegetation not be "greater than ten inches on average". The Ordinance also provides the cutting and removal such as weeds, grass and vegetation once in every three weeks between April 1 and November 1, shall be deemed to be in compliance with this ordinance.

We have **Snap Circuits** available for use in the library. Thank you to the VVS Education Foundation for making this possible.



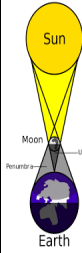

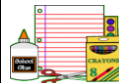

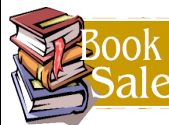
