From the City Manager, Brandon M. Lovett

On behalf of the City of Sherrill employees and administration I'd like to wish everyone a Happy & Healthy 2019. The progress made in the city in 2018 was remarkable. We saw the completion of the DPW garage

renovation project and the construction of new parking and access to the Michael Holmes, City Clerk/Comptroller DPW, Water and Power & Light properties. The CAC underwent some major improvements including a cosmetic face lift of the interior as well as a full renovation to the 2nd floor bathroom and bowling balcony. The Briggs & Stratton project is nearing completion and will be in full swing early in 2019. The ONX3 developer has transformed the former Oneida Limited property. His ideas are grand, and we are excited to see his Jason Merrill, Deputy Mayor vision continue to come into focus in 2019.

We are looking for 2019 summer concert series sponsors. If you are Tom Dixon interested, please contact Sara Getman at the CAC. We will announce our 2019 concert lineup in the early spring. To follow up on a successful 2018, we have our construction projects (315) 363-9234, jshay@sherrillny.org planned for 2019. Our annual road, sidewalk and curb program will focus on Ransom Ave from School Street to Betsinger Road, and Noto Drive. The City received a \$100,000 DASNY Infrastructure grant on behalf of Senator Joseph A. Griffo to start this work next summer. In addition to this funding, in 2018 the City was awarded grant funding from the Oneida County Youth Bureau for Summer Youth programing, the Arbor Day Foundation for tree plantings, the Finger Lakes-Lake Ontario Watershed Police Department- Please note these Protection Alliance for a tree inventory and maintenance program, and a \$75,000 DASNY grant via Senator Griffo to fund a new plant generator at efficient response. the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

The City is anxiously awaiting news on several other grant applications we've made during the last few months. Announcements for the NYS Department of Transportation Alternatives Program should arrive soon. We also expect notifications from the NYSERDA LED Street Light grant and the FEMA Assistance to Firefighters grant applications in early 2019.

As we head into the New Year, our ongoing commitment to an accessible and transparent local government is a top priority. We are proud of our community-based approaches and involvement that steadily move the city forward. Feel free to contact me anytime to share your thoughts and ideas to continue to make Sherrill a great place to live.

Assessor's News



Thank you to everyone who came to see Santa when he came to Sherrill!

Membership-The department is always looking for new members, especially junior members! If you're interested in Fire Fighting, EMS, or scene support and are 18 years of age or older for adult membership or 16 years old for junior membership, visit the fire station during our Wednesday Night Drill that starts at 6:50pm every week for information!

Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors Save Lives- Make sure all your smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries are changed and change out detectors that are older that ten years old for new ones. These detectors provide your first notification of a fire or unsafe carbon monoxide levels in your home.

Safe Driving- Alcohol use impairs skills needed to drive a car safely. It slows reaction time and impairs judgment and coordination. Alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes kill someone every 48 minutes. Don't drink and drive, and don't let others drink and drive.

Home Heating Safety- Make an "Adult Only Zone" and keep anything that may burn 3 or more feet away from heating elements like wood stoves, space heaters, furnaces, fireplaces etc. Turn off space heaters when leaving a room. Make sure the exhaust pipe from the furnace is clear of snow. Blocked pipes can lead to carbon monoxide buildup in the home. Never use an oven to heat your home.

Some will remember "The Storm of '94"- Remember to always dress for the weather and to always be prepared for a winter storm. Never use a generator indoors.

March 1, 2019 is the deadline for filing certain property tax exemption applications with the Assessor's office. Many exemptions including the Senior Citizen's and Enhanced STAR exemptions do not automatically renew and require annual applications and proof of qualifying income.

The Senior Citizen's exemption, with far lower income limits than the Enhanced STAR exemption, is normally based on the previous year's income. You must provide proof of your previous year's income. Form SS 1099 is one of the documents, in addition to tax returns, often needed to prove your income level. Please bring in receipts for out-ofpocket unreimbursed medical and prescription expenses including dental, health insurance premium payments, eyeglasses, hearing aids and others as defined by the IRS. These are used to reduce your income.

For Enhanced STAR the required age is 65 regardless of when you turn 65 during 2019 and 2017 income. The State now requires all those eligible for Enhanced STAR, both new and currently enrolled homeowners, to register for Automatic Renewal. For more information see the brochure posted on the City's website. Applications for the Income Verification Program are available at the Assessor's office. This process cannot be used for any other income-related exemption including the Senior Citizen's exemption.

If you purchased a residence in Sherrill prior to May 1, 2014 and have not previously applied for the Basic STAR exemption, you may qualify for this significant property tax exemption designed to lower your school tax bill. The residence must be your primary residence to qualify for Basic STAR. Renewal to continue the Basic Star exemption is NOT necessary. *For more information about important STAR changes visit https://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star/default.htm

Bob has set the following dates and times to process exemptions at City Hall by the March 1 deadline: January 16, 9am-12pm for Enhanced STAR; All exemptions, February 7, 8, 11, 12, 15, 19, 26-28 & March 1, 9am-12pm; any changes to this schedule will be posted at www.sherrillny.org. An appointment, if more convenient, can be scheduled by contacting Bob. Property owners who are considering construction are welcome to meet with Bob to discuss the potential change to your City assessed value.

The Town of Vernon Assessor's Office, located in the Vernon Town Hall next to the elementary school, welcomes inquiries from all town property owners, residents, and taxpayers. Sherrill residents can receive some of the same services that they receive from the Sherrill Assessor's Office at the Vernon Assessor's office, including assistance relating to exemption applications. The Vernon Assessor's hours are Monday & Thursday, 9am-2pm through February. Frank Laguzza, (315) 829-2587, is the Chairman of the Town of Vernon Board of Assessors.

Winter Garbage Pick-up Reminders- Please do not place garbage cans or recyclables in the sidewalk because it interferes with sidewalk clearing. Please place containers at the edge of your driveway between the sidewalk and road. Also, please cover garbage and recyclable cans. Rainwater & snow significantly increase the weight to unsafe handling limits for the sanitation crew.

Christmas Trees- The DPW will pick up trees as weather permits or they can be dropped off anytime, at no charge at the green waste location at the DPW barn.

Transfer Station- The Transfer Station is open on Saturdays, 8am-1pm until spring. Disposal coupons must be purchased at City Hall prior to dropping off items. Visit <u>www.sherrillny.org/departments/public</u> works/ or contact City Hall for information.

Wood Ashes- At the end of Fairway Lane, there is an area for dropping off properly extinguished wood ashes.

Snow Reminder

Article 1219 of New York State VTL prohibits plowing, shoveling or blowing snow into a street or highway. This includes plowing the snow across a roadway to areas across from your driveway. Fines for a first offense include up to a \$150 fine and/or 15 days in jail plus applicable surcharges.

Vehicle/Trailer Ordinance Reminder

The storage, whether permanent or seasonal, of all motor vehicles, trailers, campers, motor homes, boats, crafts, vessels and recreational vehicles/ATVs shall only be permitted in the side yard, no more than 5 feet further than the front of the house, and in the rear yard and shall be limited to two in number. They must also be a minimum of 5 feet away from any property boundary line.
