


# **City of Sherrill Spring 2019 Newsletter** www.sherrillny.org



From the City Manager, Brandon M. Lovett

Happy Spring!!! It was a long winter and our crews are eager to get to work on many projects. The City was fortunate to receive a \$100,000 DASNY Infrastructure Grant from Senator Joseph A. Griffo (R-47). This year's road work will focus on Ransom Ave. from School Street to Betsinger Road, and Noto Drive. Crews will complete utility structure work, milling and paving. Crews will complete the decorative retaining wall on Betsinger Road, paint roads, and prepare our parks and green spaces for the season by planting flowers, trimming trees, putting out mulch and more. Green waste collection starts April 8 and continues through October on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of each month. There are details and a calendar on page 4.

Sherrill Power and Light is preparing to begin work on the \$50,000 LED Street Light grant we received from NYSERDA. Crews will convert the antiquated street lights to energy efficient LED fixtures which will reduce maintenance and operation costs and provide cleaner light for pedestrians and motorists.

The City is working with Barton and Loguidice (B&L) on a follow up to the \$30,000 Consolidated Funding Application Engineering Grant we received in 2018. The New York State Dept. of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) requires disinfection procedures for the City's wastewater treatment plant effluent to be operational by May 2022. B&L submitted an engineering report and evaluation of the plant and the collection and disinfection systems to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (NYSEFC) and NYSDEC in late 2018. The plant has been in continuous operation for nearly 40 years since the last major upgrade and many of the components of the plant are now operating past their useful lives. The City is working to come up with a plan to update the 1980sera equipment to improve operational efficiency, reduce maintenance costs, and to continue to comply with requirements. B&L will estimate capital costs to "modernize" the treatment plant including effluent disinfection, replacement of all old equipment, building updates and site improvements. The report qualified for 50% subsidized interest rates, and co-funding opportunities through the NYSEFC.

In the weeks ahead residents will notice the City's new Sherril Police sedan in service. The vehicle is currently being outfitted for service, and residents will notice a new graphic design on the vehicle. The City Commission met with delegates from the Sherrill Kenwood Fire Department in late 2018 to discuss a fire apparatus replacement plan and will continue to meet on this topic moving forward.

Representatives from Congressman Brindisi's office will be at City Hall May 8 from 9-11am. The office is holding mobile hours so constituents can share a legislative opinion or receive help from a federal agency right in their community. We encourage any interested residents to stop by.

The 2019 concert series is set, and the entertainment schedule is posted on the City's website. The City's Fireworks weekend is packed full of excitement. There will be Car Cruise In on Tuesday July 23 at Reilly-Mumford Park and a Luau will take place at the Al Glover Pool on Wednesday July 24 featuring a performance by Gary Johnson on the pool deck. The City 9-Hole Golf Tournament will be held at OCGC on Thursday July 25. Classified will perform on Friday night July 26 at *Reilly-Mumford Park* which is a new location for 2019. The Silver City 5K will take place Saturday morning July 27, followed by a performance by Showtime in the evening at the gazebo. And of course, a spectacular Fireworks display will close out the night.

On behalf of the City of Sherrill I'd like to congratulate Power and Light Superintendent Robert Mumford on his pending retirement and thank him for his 30+ years of service with the City. We wish you and your family all the best!! The City hired Jim Whitcombe as the new P&L Superintendent in early 2019. He has been shadowing Rob and has already hit the ground running.

# **Spring Fire Safety Tips**

# **BBQ/Grilling Safety**

-Get your grill cleaned and serviced. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage.

-Never use gasoline to start a fire.

-Use charcoal lighter fluid only before the fire is lit.

-Place grills away from buildings, fences, deck railings, landscaping etc.; these can easily and quickly ignite.

-Keep a garden hose or portable fire extinguisher handy in case the fire gets out of control.

-Never bring a grill into the home. The carbon monoxide produced by burning charcoal can be dangerous, even deadly, in an enclosed space.

-Keep children and pets away from fires and grills. It only takes a second for curiosity to cause a burn.

-Though coals may appear cool, always soak them with water. Coals retain enough heat to reignite for days after the fire.

-If your bag of charcoal gets wet, leave it in a wellventilated area away from the house. During drying, spontaneous ignition can occur in confined areas.

# **Outside Safety Tips**

-Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street.

-Clean up yard debris. Cut back dead limbs and grasses. -Maintain a clear 'fire zone' of 10' around structures.

-Check outdoor electrical outlets and appliances.

-Keep 100' of garden hose with an attached nozzle connected and ready for use.

-When refueling your mower, make sure the engine is off and cool. Don't spill gasoline on a hot engine, and don't smoke while pouring gasoline.

-Wear proper eye protection when operating trimmers, lawn edger's, pruners and power saws.

# **Home Safety Tips**

-Test and clean smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. -Check your fire extinguishers.

-Clean your oven and stovetop cooking surface.

-Keep combustible items such as oven mitts, towels, utensils, paper towels, etc. off the top of the stove.

-Check for and correct frayed or damaged extension cords and wiring on all appliances.

-Prepare for storm-related outages. Ensure flashlights and portable radios have batteries and other supplies such as bottled water, are stocked and available.

-Practice exit drills so everyone knows what to do in case of an emergency. Establish a meeting place.

-Properly store household chemicals and never mix cleaning agents.

-Recycle old newspapers, magazines and junk mail.

-Make sure you clean the lint filter from your dryer before or after each load of laundry. Remove lint that has collected around the drum.

# **Garage Safety**

-Clean up and properly store paints and chemicals. -Check fuel containers for leaks & properly store them. -Have power equipment cleaned and serviced.

# Sidewalk Replacement Program

The City of Sherrill periodically repairs and replaces sidewalks throughout the city. If the City is doing a reconstruction project, and/or installing new sidewalks as part of a capital project then there is no cost to the homeowner.

If property owners desire to replace the sidewalk in front of their property they may contact City Hall at (315) 363-2440. The City will contribute 70% towards the total cost and will handle the work. The homeowner will be responsible for 30% of the cost, prior to construction, if they desire their sidewalk to be replaced.

Availability and approval for these projects is dependent upon the city having the funding and the time available to complete these projects. Please contact City Hall with questions.

# **REFUSE & RECYCLING REMINDER**



Containers shall have handles and be tightly covered, watertight, galvanized iron, nonrusting metal, or plastic with a capacity of no less than 10 gallons and no more than 35 gallons per container.

Plastic bags alone are not acceptable for garbage containment. Household trash in bags must be placed in an approved container. Plastic bags shall not be placed in recyclable bins or used for the containment of recyclables.

The combined weight of a single container and its garbage or recyclable contents shall not exceed 40 pounds.

Tethering devices are prohibited.



Contractors must obtain a permit from City Hall to drop off brush or greenwaste from residents or businesses.




