

From City Manager, Brandon M. Lovett

On behalf of the City of Sherrill employees and administration I would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. As we head into Winter, please remember that The City has snowshoes and cross-country skis available to our

area youth and families to utilize during the winter months This equipment was donated by the Edwin J. Wadas Foundation in 2022. Please contact the Recreation Dept. to reserve equipment. Barry VanDreason and his staff continue to build our communities recreation and community activity offerings. Please keep an eye on the City's Facebook Page, and Sherrillrec.com for the upcoming events.

We are hopeful that the weather will cooperate this winter to allow for us to create the outdoor ice rink for the community to enjoy. A few things to remember, unlike Rockefeller Center, we do not have a chiller under the ice to keep it frozen. We are 100% reliant on the weather. To flood and maintain the rink the weather needs to be a consistent 14 degrees Fahrenheit when it is not snowing and not windy. To build a base, we need a three-to-fiveday period of these temperatures and conditions. You can only flood the surface 1/2 to 1 inch of water with each application. Light flooding is preferred to heavy flooding. Over-watering or flooding when the temperature is not cold enough creates a shell of ice on top of the water. Ice that is only frozen on top is not suitable for skating, since the shell breaks when weight is applied on it. Some of the hurdles we face in maintaining steady ice are the inconsistent cold days, we've seen warmer temperatures over the last several years, snowfall which can insulate, soften and deteriorate the ice and direct sunlight which can soften, melt or heave the ice making it unusable. If we are able to make and maintain ice for skating the City will put out an email blast and post it to our Facebook page. When the yellow barricades and no skating signs are out, you must stay off the ice surface.

Oneida County completed the W. Hamilton Ave. Bridge project around this time last year. In the weeks ahead you'll see National Grid replacing the gas line by directional boring under the creek. According to National Grid they will remove the steel support that the "old' gas line is currently attached to in the Spring.

A few things to remember this winter, homeowners/tenants are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of snow/ice on the sidewalk in front of their property. The City does clear sidewalks as a courtesy after streets and other priorities are properly addressed. Please provide clear access to your water/electrical meters for meter reading. NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law prohibits snow/ice or any foreign objects to be blown or pushed into a public street. Snow from a driveway shall not be pushed into or across the street. Parking overnight is prohibited. Our DPW crews often work long shifts to keep our streets safe and clear. Also, please yield to snow removal operations for the safety of our employees as well as you and your passengers.

As we slide past the observation of Veteran's Day, I thought to make this note all about headlines during the two world wars. Hopefully reminding one and all that the day's observances stem from the first world war when the armistice was signed at the 11th hour, on the 11th day, of the 11th month. That signing brought about the beginning of Armistice Day, later to become Veteran's Day.




This winter please clear the area around fire hydrants in front of or near your homes. In the event of an emergency, a cleared hydrant can save precious time for firefighters.




Winter Youth Hitting Clinics

-The 2023 City budget public hearing will be on December 11, 2023, at 7:15 pm. There is no proposed tax increase, and the tax rate remains at \$8.00 per \$1,000 assessed value. Additionally, there is no

proposed increase in sewer rates for 2024. The City is in the midst of a electric rate study performed by our regulator, the New York Power Authority in conjunction with the city. New electric rates are anticipated to be rolled out in the late spring or early summer 2024. Once the rate proposals have been completed there will be a public hearing set for the City residents and they must be approved by the New York Power Authority's Board of Directors. Additional information will follow.

-The city continues to see an increase in utilization of the online bill pay through the various choices offered; credit card, debit card, EFT payments, pay by phone or text for utility billings. You can get reminder alerts, schedule reoccurring payments, or get you utility bill e-mailed to you directly.
